Lake too!


Gee, this place

That's Kelly, the Kingfisher. It looks as though she's cleaning her feathers but she's actually waterproofing them!




Dee Dee sees Kelly the Kingfisher nearby.

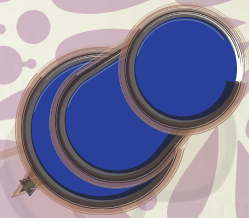
