COMMEMORATIVE ELEMENTS OF GARDENS BY THE BAY'S 10TH ANNIVERSARY



Dendrobium Gardens by the Bay 10th Anniversary

(Dendrobium Milo x Dendrobium racieanum)

Dendrobium Gardens by the Bay 10th Anniversary, a special commemorative orchid, was bred by Gardens by the Bay's Research and Horticulture Department, under the Gardens orchid hybridisation programme. The programme, which began in 2015, specialises in hybrids that can thrive in both warm and cool conditions. Dendrobium Gardens by the Bay 10th Anniversary will be showcased at

Mediterranean Garden in Flower Dome, alongside other orchid hybrids bred by the Gardens.

The orchid is of fine pedigree, drawing upon the best of Singapore's orchid history through its parent, *Dendrobium* Milo, a hybrid created by famous local orchid breeder Mr Syed Yusof Alsagoff. It contains in its lineage well-known species of the antelope-type Dendrobiums, famed for their intricately twisted petals that add a touch of exquisiteness to the small but numerous flowers. The hybrid also represents the best of Gardens by the Bay – a beautiful composition of substance and style, it exhibits excellent vigour and exquisite flowers that are mangosteen-purple in colour, associated with the colours of the Gardens' brand.

Elegance in the flowers is further accentuated by the alluring twists in the petals and sepals, while the flowering is prolific and long-lasting, under both warm and cool conditions. The inflorescence comprises 12 to 14 flowers beautifully arranged in a spiraling symmetry along the peduncle – a beauty in nature's perfection. These hybrid qualities are timeless and they symbolise the Gardens' continuous pursuit of excellence.

Orchids have been synonymous with Gardens by the Bay since its conceptualisation. Since then, Gardens by the Bay has continued to bring the world of plants to Singapore, including showcasing a vast collection of orchids from all over the world.

This collection provides the potential for novel genetics to be harnessed in orchid breeding. With the focus of Gardens by the Bay's orchid hybridisation programme being in pioneering new breeding lines from crosses between warm and cool growing orchids, offspring are adapted to grow and flower in both the cooled conservatories as well as the outdoor gardens. Not being limited to their niche climatic conditions is an approach that was novel to Singapore's local breeding efforts.

Through this approach, it is possible to expand the genetic pool from which desirable plant and floral traits could be bred. This approach reflects the innovative spirit of Gardens by the Bay over the past 10 years.





Perpetual Blooms sculpture

An art piece by Cultural Medallion recipient Ms Han Sai Por, this collection of 12 stainless steel sculptures symbolises the state of perpetual bloom of flowers at Gardens by the Bay. Standing elegantly over water, at heights between 1.5m and 3m tall, the highly polished stainless steel of each piece reflects the soothing colours of the sky and the verdant surroundings of Serene Garden, where it stands. The changing colours of nature, are in turn, a reflection of life and vibrancy. Among the blooms are two dragonflies that portray the

harmony of flora and fauna found in the Gardens. Beyond the dragonfly being the logo of Gardens by the Bay, dragonflies are indicators of clean water in a healthy ecosystem, signifying the sustainable foundations of the Gardens.

The sculpture was gifted by Mr Tan Aik Hock to Gardens by the Bay on the occasion of its 10th anniversary.

Seasons of Bloom floral display

The finale floral display marking Gardens by the Bay's tenth anniversary pays tribute to the various seasons of flowers that Flower Dome has brought to visitors over the past decade. Snapdragons for spring, delphiniums for summer, zinnias for autumn and cyclamens for winter – these are just some of the colourful blooms visitors can look forward to.

In a nod to the year-end season, all things Yuletide-themed take centrestage in the middle of the flower field. Towering over a landscape of

snow is a dramatic Christmas tree made out of poinsettias, and an ice cavern houses beautiful seasonal blooms poignantly "frozen" in icicles – a unique collaboration with Ikebana International Singapore. In a season that is about giving, 10,000 Christmas ornaments used in the floral display have been handpainted by beneficiaries from The Salvation Army, It's Raining Raincoats, Migrants x Me and Gardens by the Bay's volunteers. Gardens by the Bay also continues its Christmas tradition of collaborating with the Embassies of Denmark, Finland, Norway and Sweden.

Seasons of Bloom is supported by Bloomberg, who have played a significant role in helping Gardens by the Bay bring back a calendar year of full-scale floral displays on the occasion of its 10th anniversary.

Nature and Sustainability tours

Come December, Singaporeans and local residents can look forward to free Nature and Sustainability tours every weekend, which is made possible through a generous \$300,000 contribution from Keppel Corporation through its philanthropic arm, Keppel Care Foundation.

This is part of Gardens by the Bay's objective to nurture a culture of sustainability in the community.

Using the Gardens as a working model of sustainability and conservation, the hour-long tours helmed by professional guides will kick off with the themes of Urban Wetlands and Carbon and Climate in the first year.

The Nature and Sustainability tours will be expanded across three years to encompass five different routes with its own theme. The additional three themes are Biodiversity and Ecosystems, Energy and Water, and Seeds and Senses. Over the three years, the tours are expected to reach more than 28,000 visitors in total.
